PRESENTER BIOGRAPHIES



Mary Lou Carney is a board-certified chaplain with the National Association of Catholic Chaplains, an adjunct professor at the University of St. Thomas, a spiritual director, a retreat leader, and a volunteer chaplain here in the Twin Cities.

Mary Lou, a Roman Catholic laywoman, earned a Masters of

Divinity Degree from the St. Paul Seminary School of Divinity, an MBA from the University of St. Thomas, and an undergraduate degree in Marketing from the University of Notre Dame. Prior to retirement, Mary Lou served as a Director of Spiritual Care for two hospitals here in the Twin Cities where her chaplain ministry focused on critical care, trauma, and end-of-life. Her volunteer chaplain ministry has included prison ministry, Catholic Charities' Dorothy Day Homeless Shelter, St. Joseph's Home for Children, and the Carondelet Village retirement community.



Elaine James is Assistant Professor of Theology at St. Catherine University. She received the Ph.D. in Old Testament from Princeton Theological Seminary. Her specialty is in Biblical Hebrew poetry, especially the love poetry of the Song of Songs. She is interested in how artistic literary practices shape ethical and theological thought.

Since joining the faculty of St. Catherine University in 2013, Professor James has taught Old Testament at undergraduate and graduate levels. She also teaches Women and the Bible, Theological Questions, and several courses for the CORE curriculum. She serves as Vice-President of the Society of Biblical Literature's Upper-Midwestern Region.

She is the author of *Landscapes of the Song of Songs: Poetry and Place* (Oxford University Press, 2017) and editor, with J. Blake Couey, of *Biblical Poetry and the Art of Close Reading* (Cambridge University Press, 2018).



Dale Korogi was born and raised in North Minneapolis, the youngest of four sons of Joseph and Mary Korogi. He grew up in St. Philip's parish, where he attended grade school. He graduated from Minneapolis Central High School and the University of Saint Thomas, where he earned a BA in Theology. His seminary studies took him to the North American College in Rome. There he received an STB (Baccalaureate in Theology) from the Gregorian University and an STL (Licentiate in Sacramental Theology) from the Athenaeum of Saint Anselm. In 1983, he was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis. His work there has included posts as Vocation Director, Rector of Saint John Vianney Seminary, Parochial Vicar of the Basilica of Saint Mary, and Chaplain at North Memorial Medical Center. He was Associate Pastor at the Church of Saint Rose of Lima in Roseville from 1984-1987. He served as Pastor of the Church of Christ the King in Southwest Minneapolis for 12 years, and became the eighth Pastor of the Church of the Ascension in North Minneapolis in 2015.
